Baljmaa finally returned to the States, and we all were reunited after 2 long months. We sure did miss her and was happy to be back together as a complete family. She was able to get a lot accomplished while back in Mongolia. The pro-life centers now have a medical facility license. That means that we can stay open always and are not subject to lockdowns. God is good. We took in two more babies in the orphanage also. Baljmaa was able to spend time with her mother while in Mongolia. Baljmaa's mom's health is staying steady and not getting any better or worse. Because of your prayer she is still able to continue her work on the Bible translation. Please remember Oyumaa in prayer and her health. The most important thing she was able to do was go to the homes of women who visit our pro-life centers and share the Gospel with them. She also spent most of her time in the orphanage.

Mongolia keeps moving the post on when they will open the borders. They are still open to only citizens who have been completely vaccinated. Now the plan is to open in July. If that is true, we will return home in July. Please pray for God to open the borders.

Since my dad went home to be with our Lord, we have had a lot of church partners want to meet us and update the ministry. We are available to meet if you would like for us to visit while we are in the States. We also lost some support and are trying to get that back with new churches that want to partner with us. If you know anyone who might be interested in being part of our ministry, please let us know and we will see what God will do. We would like to complete our meetings and get to know everyone before we return to Mongolia.

Mongolia has loosened up a lot of restrictions and we have started back with our English classes with Tengis teaching. We pray that many will be saved through these classes as we share the Gospel with them through learning the English language. We plan to start a new church with the ones that receive Christ in these classes. Please remember this in prayer.



The Covid virus has created a lot of heartache for people all over the world with death and illness. Our orphanage is not immune from the heartbreak of Covid. The boy at left was scheduled to be adopted to a couple from Italy 2 years ago. The couple flew to Mongolia and spent time with their future son in hopes of taking him home in a few weeks. When Covid broke out, Mongolia froze all adoptions, and he is still waiting to go home with his new parents. Please remember them in prayer as they struggle with the delay.
